• Food For Lane County – Karen Roth

- Summer food program (click <u>here</u> for all open sites)
 - 1. Dinners available through some school districts
 - 2. No regular vegetarian options- issues with suppliers, federal regulations around distribution, etc.
 - 3. FFLC website has 14 programs beyond emergency food box
- Emergency food box: increasing from 12 to 16 boxes per family; lots of fresh, highly perishable items
- Produce Plus: 6 rural areas in Lane Co.; at DHS offices in Eugene/Springfield/CH; 200% of poverty level; take fresh produce and bread
- Cascade Middle School Farmer's Market: Tuesdays at 2:30; free book giveaway for kids

- Recruiting migrant families for activities; free lunch for kids in the program; tutoring program; kindergarten readiness
- Currently recruiting families who have moved in the last 3 years to work or are seeking work in agriculture, fishing, forestry (contact Natalia Piar: npiar@lesd.k12.or.us)

- Closed on Fridays; quiet during the summer; new training calendar (Training Calendar Link)
- Recruiting for knapsack: nutrition education training for childcare providers; free program, free classroom support; funded through LCPH

 OHP Now Covers Me: OHP covers migrant families as well (OHP Covers Me Link)

Pearl Buck Center

- o Classes through July; 4/10 kids enrolled in KITS
- Reminder if you have concerns that a parent (pregnant up to 5 years) might have a cognitive dysfunction, refer them to PBC (even if child is not enrolled in the preschool); have bilingual/bicultural family support staff

• Willamette Family Treatment Services

 Currently moving; integrating mental health – new system to connect patients with providers; child development center at capacity.

90by30

- Welcome Baby Box: safe sleep system with baby products and community resource guide specific to region; Period of Purple Crying (shaken baby syndrome prevention) program information; rollout begins for South and West Lane in July; adding East in the fall; families must register for a box – call 90by30 to refer families
- Roots of Empathy: launching in Lane County (19 rural classrooms); connects baby with a classroom of 1st and 2nd graders; Sarah to send list of schools; still recruiting families with babies between 2-4 mos in October (ideally local families)
- Conference on October 26: 2 registrations for \$200; tabling opportunity and discount rate for partners

DHS

o Summer EBT benefits; additional funds for SNAP benefits

- Structural changes separating Family Coaches and Benefit and Eligibility Workers allowing FCs to provide more intensive services
- New family assessment mapping: adapted for different learning needs

Trillium

- o Prenatal program: very high number of deliveries this year
- "Lunch and Learn": agencies can come to staff meetings to present about services/resources Tuesdays at 9:00 (foster care, Start Smart team, community health workers, other case mgmt. teams)
- o Veggie Rx and Produce Plus program moving forward
- Masters level clinician job opening to work with foster care and prenatal program; RN job openings for prenatal program

• Lane County Public Health

 Quiet summer: CATCH program; good behavior game training happening in August (classroom mgmt. for teachers); also tobacco, drug prevention

United Way of Lane County

- Summer Reading Spots has ended; working on a guide for next year; instead did Book Fest at the end of the school year with K-2nd grade: each student picked out 6 books; sent a letter home with summer literacy resources and other community resources
- o Best way to reach families is through the schools
- LaneKids funding starts July 1 for parenting education classes; some start this summer; will update LK website with upcoming classes

- Now collecting applications for Preschool Promise (child must be 3 or 4 by Sept. 1) High quality preschool around Lane Co (not Florence); English/Spanish applications; in person at UW or on the website (Preschool Promise Link); up to 200% poverty level
