TEMPORARY POLICY CHANGES

EMPLOYMENT RELATED DAY CARE

- No copays
- Increased the income limit
- Expanded the absent day policy
- Providers can bill DHS for short-term closures through April 2020
- Canceled the fingerprint requirement for new providers
- Increased time frames for required provider trainings

SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

- No interview required if the person applying states \$0 income
- Suspended time limits for work requirements

TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES

- Ended active JOBS disqualifications
- Ended active penalties for a person who is not cooperating with child support
- Personal Development Plans for JOBS activities can be updated based on the current situation
- The initial resource limit is now \$10,000 for new applicants (was \$2500)

GENERAL

- Allowing the SNAP online application to be used for ERDC and TANF/Refugee
- Interviews are to be completed by phone
- A telephonic option is available to complete the application and signature process for TANF
